

Shawnee County Extension Council Elections

The Shawnee County Extension Executive Board is currently accepting applications for Shawnee County residents 18 years of age or older to serve on the Shawnee County Extension Council.

The Extension Council is a 24-member council that consists of six members elected to represent each of the four mission areas: Agriculture and Natural Resources, Family and Consumer Sciences, 4-H Youth Development and Community Development. Each member is elected for a two-year term. Council members may also serve a one-year term on the executive board if elected at the annual meeting.

Members of the extension council are charged with working with county extension agents to plan, prioritize and implement a comprehensive education program designed to meet the needs of individuals and targeted issues affecting communities.

Extension Council Elections will be held Tuesday, October 14, 2014 from 7 am to 7 pm. Newly elected extension council members will begin their two-year term on **January 1, 2015**.
