Happy Spring! With the weather warming up and the 4-H programming gearing up, this is a very exciting time of year!

Registration is still open for camp at Rock Springs! You are able to attend any session that fits best in your schedule, and all enrolled Shawnee County 4-Hers are eligible for a \$100 scholarship.

Remember, May 1 is still our 4-H enrollment deadline. With the program fee please do not wait until May 1st to enroll or check your projects. We are not able to add a 4-H project on May 2nd or accept an enrollment. If you do not have your enrollment submitted by May 1st, you will not be able to exhibit at the County Fair.

Please take the time to let the new families in your club know about the importance of these deadlines. You only get Chatterbox if you are enrolled on 4-H Online. The projects you are enrolled in on May 1st are the only projects you can participate in for the county fair. GOING TO PROJECT MEETINGS DOES NOT ENROLL YOU IN THAT PROJECT. GOING TO 4-H MEETINGS DOES NOT ENROLL YOU IN 4-H. If you have any questions, please let me know. 4-H'ers can join a club after May 1st but they cannot participate in 4-H divisions of the 2023 Shawnee County Fair.

Lastly, if you are in the Horse project, the horse ID deadline has moved to June 1st. You must be enrolled by May 1st and your horse must be ID'd by June 1st if you wish to show at the fair.




All those wishing to attend a future YQCA Instructor-Led Training, note that you should register at yqcaprogram.org and complete the Pre-Test BEFORE attending the training.

YQCA Training is still required for all Shawnee County Livestock Exhibitors 4-H Age 7-18(including Meat Rabbits & Broiler Meat Chickens) and State Livestock Shows; Kansas State Fair & Kansas Junior Livestock Show(KJLS).

State Livestock Nomination Information Available



The 2023 information for state livestock nominations has been released. The process transitioned to an online system in 2022, so there are no longer physical forms for families to complete and mail. Families will purchase DNA envelopes in advance, submit their animal and exhibitor information online, then mail their completed and signed DNA samples by the deadline. Extension Agents and FFA Advisors will approve nominations online. Exhibitors who nominated animals last year (in 2022) need to use their existing ShoWorks account. Those who need help accessing their account may request a password reset through ShoWorks or contact the Youth Livestock Program for assistance. Returning exhibitors should not create a new account.

All market animals and commercial females youth would like to be eligible for the Kansas State Fair Grand Drive and/or KJLS must be nominated.
Market Beef nominations will be due May 1, with Small Animal due by June 15. The deadline to order DNA envelopes has been moved up to 10 days prior to the deadline, which is April 20 and June 5, respectively. 
