Congratulations to everyone who participated at 4-H Club Day this past weekend! We had a great afternoon and 22 4-Hers/ teams qualified to represent us at Regional Club Day on March 25th, at Wheatridge Middle School in Gardner. We do need to provide room monitors for that event, so if you would like to check off a requirement on your Achievement Pin application, let us know!

March is also a good time to go check your 4-H projects before our May 1st deadline for enrollment. You can join 4-H at any time during the year but if you want to take a project to the fair you must be enrolled in that project by May 1st. Please remember that going to project meetings does not put you in that project. You have to add them on your 4-H online profile. We are happy to help you add projects or complete your enrollment if you need it!

Because of the program fee I encourage families to enroll now. If you are paying by check you are not fully enrolled until that check has been processed at the State 4-H office. That means if you enroll a week before May 1st but pay by check you still may not be enrolled by the deadline. Do yourself a favor, take care or this today!

Lastly, if you are a volunteer who has not yet or needs to renew your volunteer screening, don't forget to sign up for our volunteer training on March 30th! RSVPs are due to the office by March 27th.

It is open to youth 7-21 years of age and focuses on food safety, animal well-being, and character development. The YQCA program transitioned to a new platform in March of 2022, so it is no longer affiliated with 4HOnline. Families who completed their training prior to the transition last spring will need to navigate to the new website and create a new user account.

All those wishing to attend a future YQCA Instructor-Led Training, note that you should register at yqcaprogram.org BEFORE attending the training.

YQCA Training is still required for all Shawnee County Livestock Exhibitors 4-H Age 7-18(including Meat Rabbits & Broiler Meat Chickens) and State Livestock Shows; Kansas State Fair & Kansas Junior Livestock Show(KJLS).
