

Please bring your empty/used 12 count egg cartons to the office and let someone know they are for school enrichment. Every donation is greatly appreciated.





Grades 9-12: Select an historical figure from the era of the American Revolution and discuss how he or she influenced the war, their history, and their contributions to the new nation.


