2025 Shawnee County Fair: Barnyard Bash at the Shawnee County Fair! With the county fair this month here are a few tips to help you have a great fair experience:

- Keep cool and have fun! Fair can be a stressful time for everyone.
- Try and remember the reason for exhibiting at the County Fair: to support the knowledge gained by youth in their project that year. No matter the color of the ribbon received we want to celebrate how much they have learned!
- Know when exhibit check-in and judging times are. Times and places do change from year to year so double check the fair book schedule! All of the exhibits this year will be in the Expo Center or Domer Arena.
- Don't be afraid to ask questions! If you have a question about an exhibit, ask your division superintendent or the Extension Staff. On Thursday and Friday there will be someone at the information table in Expo to help you.
- When in doubt, read your fair book. The county fair book is a great place to start when you need to know division rules or what materials you need to bring for your exhibit.

The County Fair is a great time to enter your State Fair exhibits! There will be forms at the info table in Expo. State Fair entries are due August 8th for everything except livestock and horse. Youth 9 and older can enter for the state fair and many of the exhibits can be transported by the Extension office. We take a minivan so we cannot take projects that are larger than a geology box.

Please make sure you or someone you know is picking up your fair entries on Sunday, July 28th at 5:30pm or immediately following the Fashion Revue. All exhibits need to be removed from the fair between the end of Fashion Revue and 6:30pm. If you pick up exhibits for another youth, please communicate with that family you are doing so before you leave the fair. No exhibits can be picked up before the conclusion of the Fashion Revue.

Once again this year we will be loading the fair semi-trailers after the fair on Sunday. Please plan to stay around the fair for a little while to help us put the fair away.

Thank you in advance to all the volunteers that help make the Shawnee County Fair possible. We look forward to seeing you July 19th for the Horse Show and July 25th-28th at the Shawnee County Fair!

Important Update to Livestock Rules for County Fair

Sheep, Swine & Meat Goat Limits Increased

The maximum number of entries for all three small animal livestock species has been increased! You can now bring 3 animals/phase of the project (breeding or market) with a maximum of 6 animals/species. So you could bring up to 3 market hogs & 3 gilts, 3 market lambs & 3 breeding ewes, and 3 market goats & 3 breeding does. All county fair animals must be tagged either at their species Weigh-In date or by the Friday immediately following if you are unable to make it to tagging & weigh-in. Animals tagged outside of weigh-in will not be eligible for the Rate of Gain contest at the fair.

Review of Livestock Sale Rules

The limit for the premium auction will still be 2 animals/4-Her. Beef, Sheep, Swine, Meat Goats, Poultry, & Meat Rabbits are all eligible. We will use the same structure as in the 2024 fair, with the option to sell you animal for premium only and take it home, or sell it for premium and floor & have a buyer send it to a locker. Youth from all species will be required to complete YQCA training, attend 2 of 3 educational sessions hosted by the Livestock Committee, and turn in livestock drug withdrawal & buyer forms in order to sell an animal through the premium auction.

MANHATTAN, Kan. – The Kansas 4-H Youth Development program has recognized more than three dozen youth as state project award winners.

Sarah Maass, state leader for the Kansas 4-H program, said "being a state project winner indicates prior excellence and points to (youth's) future potential."

"Youth must display leadership skills and hearts for service by organizing events like community service projects, project meetings to share their expertise with younger 4-H members, and other unique efforts," Maass said.

One state winner is selected yearly from the senior division (ages 14-18) in 45 project categories. Kansas 4-H youth submit a project report form, a summary of their work in a certain project.

Maass notes that in addition to learning new project skills, these youth must also demonstrate growth and strength in leadership, organization, civic engagement, and communication within the project.


