<u>Teacher Provides</u>: Perishable food, Copies of worksheets

This program is delivered to your school office and loaned out for 4 weeks. My Plate A Yummy Curriculum is designed to introduce the importance of physical activity and eating from all 5 food groups.

#### Wheat Science

Grade: 4

Cost: \$3.00 per kit (each kit serves 3 students)

Standard: KCCRS Social Studies Economics and MW Region content

Math: 4.MD.2

Date: January

<u>Program Includes:</u> One bread kit per 3 students, classroom bread making instructions, teacher handbook, and a wheat DVD

<u>Teacher Provides:</u> DVD player, water, oil, measuring utensils, and an oven to bake bread in

This program is delivered to your school office and loaned out for 2 weeks. During that time youth will learn about Kansas wheat and wheat processing. Each youth will get to prepare their own loaf of bread to take home.



# Chicken Embryology

<u>Grade</u>: 2nd –3rd <u>Cost</u>: \$7.00

<u>Approximate Dates</u>: Feb. 13th thru March 7th and March 27th thru

April 19th

Standard: NGSS 3-LS1-1;3-LS3-1

<u>Program Includes</u>: 1 dozen fertilized eggs, incubator, thermometer, detailed instructions, educational

material, DVD, chicken book, and chicken food.



<u>Teacher Provides</u>: Daily observation, turning the eggs 3 times a day, DVD player

Extension Staff will deliver the program and can give a 10-15 minute presentation about what the youth can expect over the next 4 weeks upon request. Youth will learn about chicken growth and development, daily journaling, record keeping, and the responsibility involved in taking care of chickens. Youth will understand the importance of proper egg and chicken handling as well has proper hand washing.



# Fraction Power: Layered Cookie Mix

Grade: 2nd-4th

Cost: \$5.00 per kit (each kit serves 4

students)

Dates: October, December, February,

and April

<u>Standard</u>: KCCRS Math: 3.MD.3; 4.MD.2; 4.NF.3; 3.NF.1; 3.OA.8; 2.OA.1

<u>Program Includes</u>: All the materials to make the cookie mix, handouts, and curriculum material

<u>Teacher provides</u>: Volunteers to help with the assembly of the mix.

This program will be delivered to your school office and loaned out for 3 weeks. Youth will make a layered dry oatmeal chocolate chip cookie mix. They will use their math skills to measure out the ingredients for the mix.

#### Ants

Grade: 1st- 4th Cost: \$7.00

Standard: NGSS 2-LS4; 3-LS2-1; 4-LS1-1

<u>Program Includes:</u> Ant farm, live ants, ant food,

handouts, and DVD's

<u>Teacher Provides:</u> Daily observation, DVD player, and own sand if using a personal ant farm

The ant farms will be left for the youth to observe. Youth will observe how ants have their own complex society and rely on teamwork to build their tunnels. They will also study ant anatomy.


